Maroondah Federation Estate

Maroondah Federation Estate is a community, cultural and arts facility that has been constructed on the site of the former Ringwood Primary School. Surrounded by beautiful gardens that are admired and enjoyed by all visitors, Maroondah Federation Estate is the ideal venue for meetings, functions, parties and product launches. Throughout the site there is a range of innovative artistic features on display such as the architecture of the buildings, a heritage trail, public art sculptures and creatively designed gardens.

Maroondah Art Gallery

The Maroondah Art Gallery offers visitors a unique and inspiring experience. The constantly changing exhibitions capture both historical and contemporary elements while showcasing a local and national flavour. The exhibition program features a wide range of media and a diverse array of quality works that may not otherwise venture outside of the central Melbourne business and arts precinct. The Gallery is located at the Maroondah Federation Estate.

Wyreena Community Arts Centre

Wyreena Community Arts Centre is set within a magnificent historical property featuring Tudor style buildings, a glass house Conservatory Café overlooking an adventure playground and all within 5 acres of delightful gardens. The Centre offers an abundance of arts and cultural experiences including a diverse art, craft and lifestyle program, Gallery and Gift Shop and a range of community events throughout the year.

Ringwood Highland Games

The Ringwood Highland Games is one of the biggest Scottish Festivals in Victoria. It is always a wonderful spectacle with pipe bands, Highland and Scottish country dancers, Highland Cattle, rides for children and a large variety of stalls. There is also **free entry** to "Hurl the Haggis". The Highland Games are held late March – Early April at Jubilee Park, Ringwood. For a wee taste of Scotland – come along!

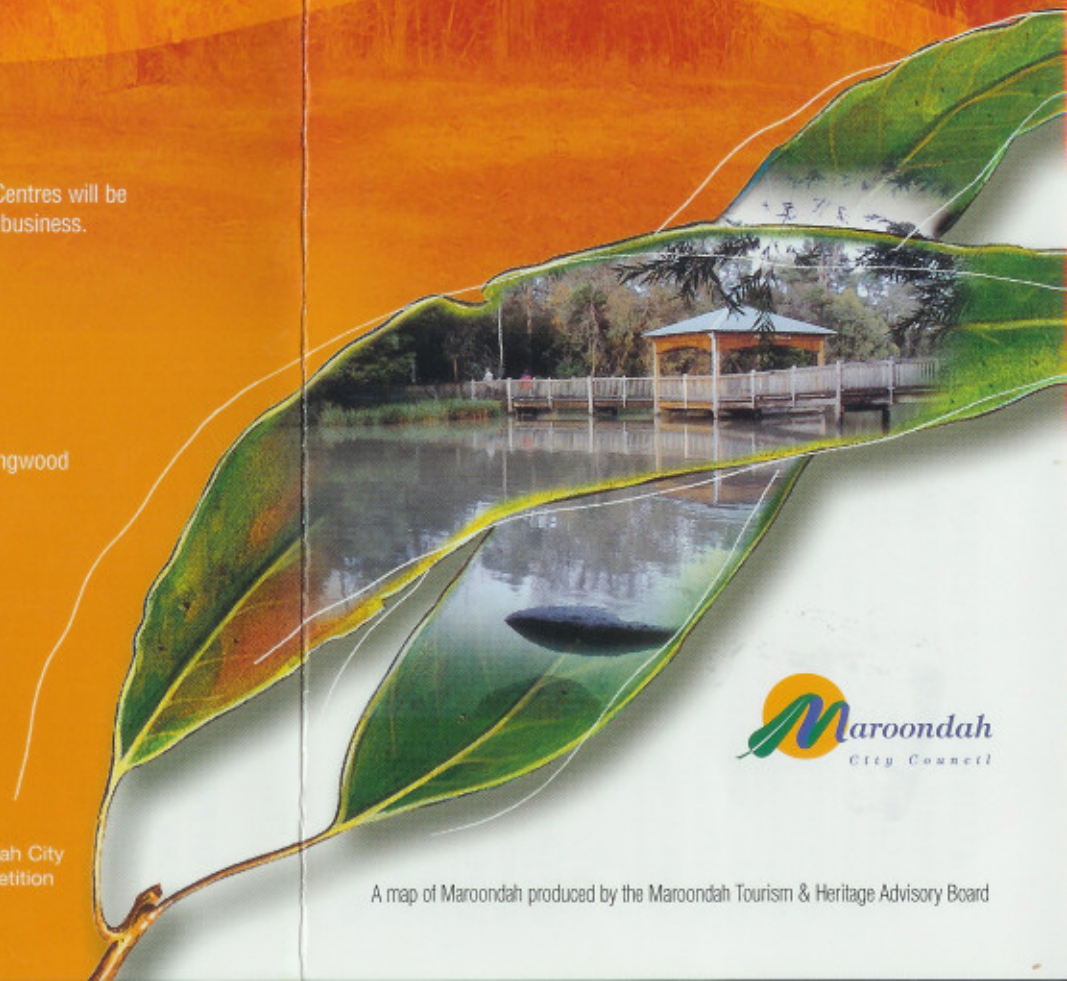

Maroondah Welcomes You

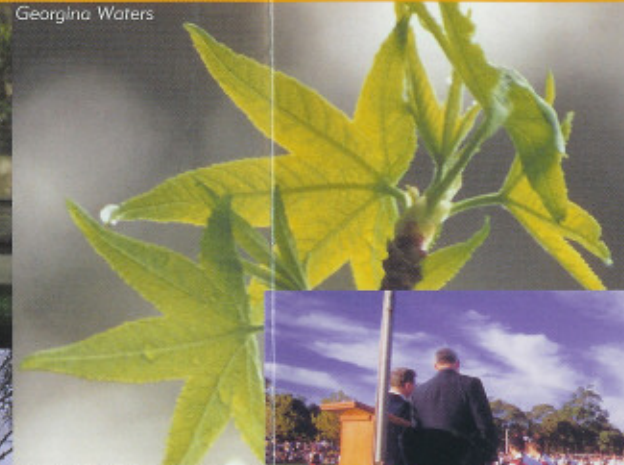

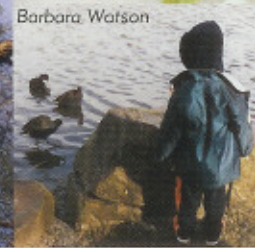
